

## Impromptu by Misha's Vineyard Pinot Noir 2015

The palate is elegantly expressed and beautifully weighted, offering silky texture and fine tannins. 4 stars \* \* \* \* \* "From Misha's Vineyard, this estate-grown Bendigo red is made in a 'more upfront, sweet-fruited' style than its similarly priced stablemate, Misha's Vineyard Cantata Pinot Noir. Still youthful, the 2015 vintage (4\*) was matured in French oak hogsheads (17 per cent new). Bright ruby, it is full-bodied, vibrantly fruity and supple, with excellent depth of berryish, plummy, spicy flavours, considerable complexity, and a finely textured finish. It's delicious now." 17.5/20 🖈 🖈 🖈 "Moderately deep garnet-hued ruby-red colour with a paler edge. The nose is softly full and up-front with good volume of harmoniously layered aromas of red berry fruits forming a gentle core, intermingling with dark herbal nuances, along with lifted, ethereal red florals. Medium-bodied, the palate is soft and gently rich with red berry fruit flavours integrated with dark herb notes and nuances of liquorice and spice. The fruit is supported by light, supple, tannin extraction with balancing, fresh, lacy acidity, lending attractive accessibility. The flavours build in intensity and carry to a softtextured finish. This is a pretty, soft and elegant, harmonious red berry fruited Pinot Noir with herb and floral detail and a supple, accessible palate. Serve with salmon, tuna and poultry dishes over the next 3 years. 57% clone 777, 5% clone 5 and 4% each clone 667 and Abel, indigenous yeast fermented with 15% whole bunches to 14.0% alc., the wine spending 24 days on skins and aged 16 months in 17% new 300L French oak barrels. 17.5/20 Feb 2018."
