94/100 "From a single vineyard site, the bouquet is both classic and seductive with aromas of exotic flowers, white spice, white-fleshed fruits and persistent mineral perfume. On the palate, it is elegant, charming and sophisticated, warm and complex, dry and lengthy. Flavours of tangerine peel and

preserved lemon, apple and fragrant exotic fruits. The white spice and acidity invigorate the palate finishing with a silky mouthfeel tease. Delicious, fresh, dry and spicy. Best drinking from 2022 through 2028. This wine will age well." September 2021 (Cameron Douglas MS, www.camdouglasms.com)

**94/100** "Delicately luscious gewürztraminer in an off-dry style with white rose petal, Turkish Delight, lychee, anise and spice flavours. The wine has great purity and a perfect sweet-and-sour balance that is quite refreshing." Sept 2021 (Bob Campbell MW, www.therealreview.com)

**94/100** "Bright, pale straw-yellow colour, slightly lighter on the rim. The bouquet has elegance and depth, filled the glass with aromas of lychees, guava, interweave ginger powder and exotic flowers. Medium-bodied, off-dry to taste, a spicy palate assembled of lychees, guava and a hint of pineapple, entwined with exotic florals, rose petals, ginger and Sichuan pepper. The wine is balanced and vibrant with a juicy acid line, haul along the palate with spices on a smooth mouthfeel, contributed by residual sugar and fruit concentration. This vibrant Gewurztraminer possesses exotic tropical fruit and florals and shines with lively acidity on a smooth and spicy palate. Match with firecracker chicken and fish curry over the next 4-5 years. Whole bunch pressed, fermented in older French oak barrels, 50% wild yeast. 14% alc, 10g/l RS. 18.5+/20 pts (94 pts)." vineyard wine, estate-grown at Bendigo, and 50 per cent of the blend was fermented with indigenous yeasts in old French oak barrels. Bright, light lemon/green, it is full-bodied and vibrantly fruity, with very fresh pear, lychee and spice flavours, showing excellent delicacy, gentle acidity and an off-dry (10 grams/litre of residual sugar), well-rounded finish.
