The palate is concentrated and structured with plenty of polished tannins. It's fleshy and supple, and extremely long on the finish. 93+/100 "Medium to deep ruby-purple in color, the fragrant 2010 Verismo Pinot Noir entices with a nose of black raspberries, black cherries and red currants alongside lavender, roses, earth and touches of some wild thyme. Concentrated and showing a nice backbone of medium-firm, grainy tannins offset by balanced acidity, it drinks with concentrated richness before finishing long with a savory edge to the spiciness. Only 200 cases are produced. Drink it now to 2018+. (Lisa Perrotti-Brown MW for Wine Advocate/Robert Parker)

Matured in French oak hogsheads (48 per cent new), it is deep and bright in colour, with highly concentrated plum, spice and nut flavours. A powerful, dense red, still very youthful, it's sure to be long-lived; open 2015+." (**Michael Cooper, Buyer's Guide to New Zealand Wines.**"

18.5+/20 ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ **5** Stars "A selection of the best ferments and barrels. Clones 5, Abel, 115, 777, with some clone 6 and 667, given a cold soak and indigenous yeast fermented to 14.0% alc., the wine spending approx. 24 days on skins and aged 18 months in 42% new 300 L

French oak hogsheads. Full, very dark, deep ruby-red colour with black hues, some garnet on rim. This has a full, densely packed bouquet of ripe dark raspberry and dark plum aromas unfolding layers of savoury spices, earth and liquorice and complexing dried herb nuances. Fullish-bodied, rich and mouthfilling flavours of savoury dark raspberry fruit are intermixed with dried herb, liquorice and plum, and earth elements. An array of nuances form a complex melange. The palate has considerable weight and extract to balance the fruit depth, and the structure adds to the breadth and power of the wine. The acidity is discreet, enhancing the density and concentration. This is a fulsome and layered Pinot Noir with richness, power and texture. Serve with casseroles and slow cooked red meat dishes over the next 7-9 years. 390 6-pack.. Apr 2013" (Raymond Chan, Raymond Chan Wine Reviews)
